Fair Saturday is an open access movement, and we welcome artists and performers, both amateur and professional, from every cultural discipline.






## let's celebrate together





## Case study: SEALL Festival of Small Halls

SEALL is one of Scotland's leading rural performing arts promoters. Based on the Isle of Skye, they deliver the magic of performance from remote rural venues with some of the best views in Scotland.

The award-winning Small Halls is a nine-day traditional music festival centred around St Andrew's Day and a unique cultural experience. From remote village halls on Skye and Raasay, the festival brings the music of some of Scotland's finest musicians to communities and visitors with the emphasis on celebration, friendship, festivity and feast.
